Becoming A Skilled Facilitator – Two Day Workshop

Agents are often involved in community engagement and development projects that call upon them to facilitate groups through strategic decisions, brainstorming new ideas, as well as solving community issues and county disputes. Participants attending the first day of this workshop will learn and practice the fundamentals of facilitation and will deepen your knowledge and skills around the core facilitation practices. Attendees of day 2 of this workshop will practice applied facilitation in a variety of situations important in your role as an extension agent. Participants during day 2 will receive in-depth coaching needed to become more comfortable and effective at facilitating.

Participants can attend both Day 1 and Day 2, OR, take them separately. ** It is highly recommended that participants attending Day 2 have had experience facilitating or have attended either Day 1 or another workshop in the basics of facilitation.

The workshop facilitators are Daniel Kahl, Nicole Breazeale, and Lissa Pohl of the Department of Community & Leadership Development and Jennifer Bridge Extension Agent in Meade County.

The training fee for each day is \$35 to cover lunch and materials.
