The Census Bureau has a continuously updated map online to view response rates by state, county, place, and census tract.

As of May $7^{\text {th }}, 2020$, Kentucky ranked $14^{\text {th }}$ in the nation for responding to the 2020 Census. The highest response rate was 76.8\% in Oldham County - which is also the $10^{\text {th }}$ highest response rate of any county in the nation.
