Ikaria, the Greek island, known as "the island where people forget to die," is the focus on this tour. Ikaria is one of 5 "Blue Zones", an aging hot spot where people live to be a healthy 100+ years old. The health and longevity of Ikarians is largely due to their lifestyle, which centers around having a reason to live, a focus on family. meaningful social connections, healthy diets, hard work, physical activity and spirituality. Using these lifestyle dimensions as a guide, participants will acquire unique insights regarding the Ikarian lifestyle through various hands-on activities, tours, observation and dialogue with local residents,

MS4 Communities

• Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System

- Owned by a state, city, town, village, or other public entity that discharges to waters of the U.S.
- Used to collect or convey stormwater (including storm drains, pipes, ditches, etc.)
- Not a combined sewer
- Not part of a Publicly Owned Treatment Works (sewage treatment plant)

Why Should UK be Involved?


- MS4s have limitations
 - Limited experience in public education and outreach
 - Limited connection to community (regulators)
 - Limited staff available
 - Limited time available for addressing MCMs
 - Limited interest from the permit holder (regulators/engineers... not educators)
 - Limited local support
 - A few non-profits are developing K-12 educational programs
